# The Christian Institute warns of legal action over possible ban on prayer

The Christian Institute has threatened the Government with judicial review if a proposed ban on so-called conversion therapy outlaws prayer which breaches the tenets of LGBT theology.

In a detailed legal opinion for the Institute, Jason Coppel QC confirmed that activists' proposed definitions would criminalise the ordinary work of churches.

He warned that prayer, evangelism, church membership, baptism and communion could all breach a broad conversion therapy law. Mr Coppel pointed




out that such legislation would go against UK human rights law, which protects the freedom of churches to preach and "require conformity" to their beliefs on sexual ethics and gender identity.

In May, Women and Equalities Minister Liz Truss informed Parliament that the Government will consult on how to ban 'conversion therapy' in the autumn. The consultation is expected to consider the effect of such a ban on religious freedom in England and The announcement prompted an outcry from LGBT activists angered by the decision to consult the public. Jayne Ozanne, a prominent supporter of a wide-ranging ban subsequently called for "gentle non-coercive prayer" on sexual ethics to be included in the legislation.

The Institute has also threatened the Northern Ireland Executive with legal action if it introduces a similarly broad ban in the Province.

# AUSTRALIAN STATE OUTLAWS BIBLICAL PRAYER

Pastoral advice and prayer that uphold biblical teaching on sexual ethics have been criminalised in the Australian state of Victoria. Any practice that seeks to change or suppress "sexual orientation or gender identity" is outlawed – including "prayer based practice". Offenders face up to ten years in prison and a maximum fine of over £100,000.

The state Attorney General said church ministers will be re-educated by the state to prevent them breaking the law. 10 British Conservative MP Alicia Kearns says: "The




model that's been passed in Victoria is a good one".<sup>11</sup>
